Marriage Notes (Rebecca Thorn)											
<p>From the Linesville Herald and Independent, February 17, 1886, page 4, column 1:</p> <p>"One of the most enjoyable social gatherings of the season came off last Saturday, Feb. 13. A party of about fifty of the relatives and friends of Mr. and Mrs. Isaac Ladner, took possession of their residence with the intention of reminding them that the above date was the thirty-fourth anniversary of their wedding day. Mr. and Mrs. Ladner had been kept entirely in the dark in regard to the affair, and never were a couple more completely surprised; a fact which added very much to the pleasure of the occasion. To the children of the family was mainly due this pleasant feature of the party. After a couple of hours spent in social conversation the worthy pair were marched into the dining room and presented with a fine decorated China dinner set, consisting of eighty-nine pieces - a present from their children. Mr. C.B. Brooks made a few appropriate remarks which were feelingly and gracefully responded to by the recipients. Other relatives and friends contributed a handsome eight-day clock and several other elegant and servicable articles. Immediately after the presentation the tables were spread with a rich and varied array of eatables of which all present partook with an appetite worthy of the repast. The remainder of the evening was pleasantly spent with music, singing, etc., and at a late hour the party broke up, having had a general good time which will long be remembered by all attending.</p>
