<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • His obituary was published February 10, 1909 in Linesville Borough, Crawford County, PA. From the Linesville Herald, page 1, column 1: "Horace M. Logee, MC, died at his home in this place Saturday evening February 6, 1909. He was born in Douglass, Mass., Sept. 10, 1834. In addition to a common school education he pursued studies in Lawrence Academy and in 1863 graduated from the Homeopathic Medical College of Cleveland, Ohio. Shortly after graduation he began the practice of his profession in Linesville. In 1873 he removed to Oxford, Ohio, where in addition to a large private practice he was family physician to two colleges and a boys training school. He was president of the Ohio State Homeopathic Medical Society in 1881. From 1889 to 1902 the Doctor pursued his professional career in Connorsville, Indiana, from whence he removed in the latter year to Linesville and on account of failing health retired from active practice, after forty years of busy service. Doctor Logee was twice married, his first wife being Miss Harriet E. Martin of Mass., whom he married in 1854 and by whom he had two children, Emma, now the wife of FE Bunday of this place and Frank who four years ago crossed the great divide. She died in 1861 and five years later he married Miss Lottie Hamilton of Edinboro, who survives him. He was an Abolitionist and an ardent Republican, at one time burgess of our borough. He was a Past Master of Pine Lodge 498 F&AM of this place and was a member of Maxwell Chapter No. 18 and Council No. 6 of Connorsville, Ind. For over a year he had been confined to the house and was at times a great sufferer. Death came as a release from a confining illness that after his active career was especially irksome and he passed beyond the veil "Willing," as he himself said, "to trust all to the Good Father." The sympathy of the community goes out to the bereaved family. The funeral was held at 2:30 p.m. Tuesday; interment in Linesville cemetery."
