- His obituary was published. From the Uncopied Garwood Scrapbook at the Linesville Historical Society:  
 Melvin Mann's Body Found in Linesville Creek: Resident of Linesville Believed Despondent, Last Seen Sunday Evening: (From the Evening Republican):  
 A verdict of suicide was entered Monday by Coroner Luther J. King with the finding of the body of Melvin Mann, aged about 65, in Linesville Creek, a few feet from the point at which it enters into Pymatuning Lake.  
 Mann, a resident of Linesville, was said to have been despondent since the death of his wife about a year ago. Neighbors spoke of having seen him at about 6 o'clock Sunday night, leaving his home and walking southward toward the lake.  
 A party of four fisherman found the body in the water and notified authorities in Linesville. Discovery of his hat beneath a log pointed to the theory of suicide. Mann has been a resident of Crawford county about 40 years. After the death of his wife he returned to Canada for a short time, but again took up his home at Linesville about six months ago.  
 Survivors include two daughters, Mrs. Mabel Keys and Mrs. Gertrude Edwards of St. Thomas, Ontario, Canada, and a brother, Charles Mann of Canada.  
 The remains were removed to the Peterson funeral home at Linesville where friends may call and from which place services will be held at 2 o'clock Thursday afternoon. Interment will be made in the Linesville Cemetery.
